
Tunisian Simple Stitch


Tunisian Simple Stitch (Tss) With A, chain 29

FOUNDATION ROW

Forward Pass:

To pick up a stitch, insert the hook in the second chain from the hook (using the bump on the back), yarn over (wrap the yarn in a counterclockwise direction), then draw the yarn through the chain.





When written in our pattern, it will be notated as follows:

*keeping all loops on hook, insert hook in next ch, yo and draw up a loop, repeat from * across. Do not turn.

Basic Return Pass:

Yarn over and pull through the first loop on the hook (this is exactly the same as making a chain-1). Yarn over again and draw the yarn through two loops on the hook—one of them on the hook and the next one on the shaft. For the remainder of the return pass, you will be making a yarnover and drawing through two loops. This@ eliminates one loop at a time, so that by the end of the return pass, you have one loop left on the hook. This is the way you will be working the return pass most often in Tunisian crochet, and we call it the basic return pass.



When written in our pattern, it will be notated as follows:

Rtn Pass: Yo, draw through 1 lp, *yo, draw through 2 lps; rep from * to end."

SQUARE PATTERN: repeat Tss until square measures 9" length by width.

Last Row: Skip first vertical bar, sl st in each vertical bar across.

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
