BACK POST DOUBLE CROCHET

Back post stitches appear to recede on the side of the crocheted fabric that's facing you. You can create a back-post double-crochet (abbreviated $BP\ dc$) stitch with these steps and some practice.


Work a row of normal double crochet (dc) for the first row and turn.

Follow the standard procedure for creating a row.

Chain (ch) 2 for your first double crochet.

Because a post stitch is shorter than a normal stitch, you make the turning chain with one chain stitch less than the normal turning chain requires.

Yarn over (yo) and insert your hook from back to front between the posts of the first and second double crochet in the row below, and then from front to back again between the posts of the second and third stitches.
